UPCOMING EVENTS THIS MONTH:

Troop Meetings: Make sure to check the calendar for the Monday troop meetings. We will be meeting in different locations during the month of July.

Summer Camp July 18 to July 26: Summer Camp is the highlight of every scout troop's year. We are off to what I know will be a great week at Rhode Island's Yawgoog Scout Reservation. This is the oldest continuously operating scout camp in the country and we have only been there one other time. There are a lot of great activities planned for the week including lots of advancement opportunities, boating, swimming and just enjoying the great outdoors. There are several important dates involved with summer camp:

Monday June 29, 2015: We will be at the Upper Moreland Swim Club doing swim tests and having an informal summer camp parents meeting. The parents meeting will begin at 8:00 PM. If you have questions about camp, make sure you attend this important meeting. Although we will have to retake swim tests at camp, this will be a great opportunity for the boys to practice. Even scouts not going to camp can take the test as it is a requirement for advancement.

Thursday July 16, 2015, 7:00 PM: We will pack cars for the trip to Rhode Island on Thursday July 16, 2015 at 7:00 PM. All scouts should bring their large bag for the week to the church. They will each need a smaller back pack with a day's change of clothes and toiletry items for Saturday. They will not have access to their large bags until Sunday afternoon.

Saturday July 18, 2015, 8:00 AM: We will depart HBC at 8 AM on Saturday July 18, 2015. All scouts will need a full uniform including neckerchief, troop hat, their smaller back pack and a bag lunch, water and rain gear. In addition, they will each need \$10 for dinner that night. They should also bring their medications, with the meds in their original, non-expired bottles and put in a clear Ziploc bag with their name on the bag. If anyone is in need of Troop 3 hats, shirts or neckerchiefs, please see Evelyn Caetano before we leave for camp.

Sunday July 26, 2015, 5:00 PM: The troop will return from camp around 5:00 PM. There will be a lot of gear to put away, so scouts will not be dismissed until everything is complete. This should be around 6:00PM

Camp Medical Information: Please remember that everyone attending camp, this includes scouts and scouters must have a completed physical form. They must be turned in to Mr. Atras prior to camp so that he can review them. You must also attach a copy of your son's most recent insurance card, both front and back. All medications must be given to the troop medical officer prior to departure.
