#### **UPCOMING EVENTS THIS MONTH:**

**Troop Reorganization, May 4**: We will undergo our annual troop reorganization the first Monday in May. Boys should begin to consider whether they would like to be a patrol leader. They should also think about who they would like to lead the troop in the role of Senior Patrol Leader. All of these positions are critical to the success of the troop. The new positions and patrols will take effect the first of June.

**Service to the Church and Community:** We have several service opportunities in May.

May 2, 9-4pm, **Mulching the Hatboro Baptist Garden Beds**. We already have had this event. The troop worked hard on the outside property at the church. Thanks go to all those who participated. It is always nice to give back to the church that hosts our troop.

May 9, 8-9am, 3-4pm, **Hatboro Library Bazaar**. This is our semiannual donation of time to help the Hatboro library. They rely on the money earned by the sale of used books to help cover their operating costs. Those sales would not be possible without the troop moving the 3000+ books from their storage shed to the sales tables. We will meet at the library at 8am to set-up the books and then will put the books back away at 3pm. You do not need to wear a uniform for this good turn.

May Trip, Canoeing on the Antietam Creek, May 15-17: Our May camping trip will take us to Virginia to canoe on Antietam Creek. The canoeing itself will be a day trip with us camping next to a canal near the end of our canoe route. On Sunday we will hike to a Civil War battlement site that overlooks Harpers Ferry, WV. We will meet at Hatboro Baptist Friday evening at 6pm. Scouts and Scouters should bring plenty of drinking water and sunscreen. We should be back on Sunday by 4pm.

Canoe Training, May 9: We will hold canoe training for our newest scouts on Saturday, May 9. This training is in preparation for the longer canoe trip the next week. We will meet at Hatboro Baptist at 9am (after setting up the Library Bazaar) and will return to the church by 12. Boys should bring water and should wear shoes that can get wet. We will travel over to Tyler State Park where they have a small pond and river that the boys can explore.
