# **UPCOMING EVENTS THIS MONTH:**

**Troop Meetings:** Make sure to check the calendar for the Monday troop meetings. We will be meeting in different locations each Monday during July.

**Summer Camp, Resica Falls Scout Reservation, July 13 – July 19:** We are off to the Poconos for a week of fun. I have it on good authority that the weather used up all of its rain by the beginning of July so that we will only have sunny skies during the middle of July. An information letter and packing list was given to the boys and is available on the website. The two key dates are:

**Sunday, July 13, 9am – Leave for camp.** We will meet at the Wells Fargo Bank in the Village Mall Shopping Center, Horsham at 9am. Scouts should be in full uniform including neckerchief and troop hat. They will need a day pack with water, sack lunch, and rain gear. They should also bring their medications, with the meds in their original, non-expired bottles and put in a clear Ziplock bag with their name on the bag.

**Saturday, July 19 – Return from camp.** We will return to Hatboro Baptist Saturday afternoon. The boys should be ready to be dismissed to go home by about 1pm.

Cradle of Liberty Blood Drive: The summer is traditionally a tough time for the Red Cross to collect blood for those in need. The Cradle of Liberty Council along with the F.A. Mascaro family has taken on the challenge of helping by offering a council-wide blood drive. Our own Peter Walts is heading up the drive for the council. The organization is in place. Locations have been scheduled. All that is needed now are donors... and we all know that "service to others" is integral to the Boy Scout way. There are multiple dates and locations all over the Cradle of Liberty area, but the two closest sites are listed below.

National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT, also known as Silver Stage): There is still time for interested scouts to sign up for National Youth Leadership Training. The Cradle of Liberty Council is offering two more different sessions of its acclaimed NYLT program for scouts 13-17 years old. The sessions are scheduled for August 3-9, and two weekends Sept 26-28 & Oct 3-5. This is a great experience for scouts no matter whether or not they want to take on a troop leadership position. The cost is \$265, but the troop will reimburse 50% of the cost when the course is completed.
