UPCOMING EVENTS THIS MONTH:

We will recognize all of the advancement that the scouts have accomplished in the past 6 months and will look back at all the activities the boys have engaged in over that time. These include all of the trips we have been on since October. It is always amazing to see all of the things Troop 3 does in a 6-month period. We will also be doing several special recognitions. This is an important night for the troop, so please plan on attending. I would ask anyone who is able to be at the church by 6:45 PM to assist in the sanctuary setup.

NEWS AND NOTES:

Summer Camp 2017: As everyone knows, Troop 3 will be going to Resica Falls in July of this year. Mr. Dutill has already been doing quite a bit of work behind the scenes. There will be three payments of \$130.00 due for camp fees and the **second** payment will be due on Monday March 6, 2017. We estimate the total fee will be \$390.00 for scouts. Everyone should go to camp so if you need help paying for camp, camperships are available. Please see me or Mr. Cooper if you need a campership. In addition, camperships are available from the Cradle of Liberty Council and we will have a second pancake breakfast in May. Camp cards will also be available again this year and should be out in mid-March. **Important, Please Note:** Anyone attending either Philmont, the National Scout Jamboree or NYLT can attend Resica Falls at ½ price. If you are attending one of these events and were not going to go to summer camp, please reconsider based on this information. Please inform Mr. Dutill so you can be properly recorded.

National Youth Leadership Training: National Youth Leadership Training is an exciting action packed program for councils to provide youth members with leadership skills and experiences they can use in their home troops and in other situations demanding of leadership of self and others. To be eligible for NYLT, the scout must be 13 years of age by the start of the course and be First Class. The cost is \$420.00 and there are five sessions to choose from. The cost is one half the price if this is your second week of camp and the troop will pay ½ the cost when the scout completes the program. Anyone interested in NYLT should speak with me regarding their interest. **Troop Electronics Policy:** Troop 3 has a longstanding policy on the use of electronics during meetings and camping trips. I have seen an increase in the use of electronics during both meetings and trips and based on that, have begun to write an electronics policy. This policy is currently in draft form and will be presented to the troop committee on March 9 for review and approval. It does not change the current policy, it is now simply in written form. Once approved, I will ask all scouts and their parents to read the policy and then sign it. I appreciate the support of our parents with this policy.

OA Elections: As I reported last month, on Monday February 6, 2017, Troop 3 held its annual Order of the Arrow Elections. This is the Boys Scouts of America Honor Society and all members are elected by their peers. At our February trip I tapped out two scouts who were elected to the OA and then on Monday March 20, I tapped out 6 additional scouts. These scouts included, Sean Delaney, Dan Lee, Aaron Gauthier, Michael Jaeschke, Nathan Kephart, and Harry Schultz. I am also waiting on approval from the lodge for 2 adult nominations. They now have one year to complete their ordeal and become full members of the lodge. There are several opportunities through the year including Summer Camp at Resica Falls.

New Kayaks: I want to thank George Fesmire who takes care of our entire fleet of canoes and kayaks. George has stored our fleet on his property and does maintenance on them as needed. We currently have three kayaks and recently George donated \$2,000 to purchase three more kayaks along with all of the additional equipment needed. Thanks George for your generous donation.
