TROOP 3 NEWSLETTER

Dear Troop 3 Families,

Well, what a summer this has been so far and we still have a full month to go. UPCOMING EVENTS:

Laurel Caverns Trip: We will depart for the Laurel Caverns on Friday morning August 18 at 9:00 AM. (Note that this is a Friday morning departure). On the way out to western Pennsylvania, we will stop at the Flight 93 memorial and then on the Ohiopyle State Park where we will camp for three days. On Saturday, we will go to the Laurel Caverns and explore inside the caverns. We also have geology merit badge in the afternoon. Then on Sunday, we will stop at Ft. Necessity and Mt. Davis – the highest point in Pennsylvania – before heading for home. The cost of the trip is \$33.00 for transportation, camping and Friday dinner. You should have given Mr. Murphy a reservation before this newsletter came out.

Joe Dutill Eagle Ceremony: On Monday August 14, 2017, the troop will gather in the church sanctuary to recognize Joseph Dutill with his Eagle Ceremony.
