Dear Scout Families,

I always look forward to the month of May. The school year is quickly coming to a close, many of the scouts that have been with us for seven years are preparing to move on to a new chapter in their lives and we as a troop will begin the process of re-organization and planning a new calendar year. Troop re-organization is one of the most important dates on the troop calendar. We will elect a new Senior Patrol Leader, form new patrols and then the new patrols will elect their individual patrol leaders.

I have been talking about this for several weeks now. I have told our scouts that they should be thinking about re-organization and giving serious consideration to what they want out of a new scouting year. Do they need a leadership position to advance? If so, what position are they planning? Do they want to run for SPL? If so, can they commit the time needed and will they be willing to attend National Youth Leadership Training? Where would our scouts want to travel to as part of our camping program in the next year? All of these things require careful consideration. My hope is that as a family, you will talk to your sons about these questions.

As the boys re-organize themselves, so too will the troop staff. One of the areas that we need help is Patrol Advisors. We have not been successful with our patrol advisors in the past few years. We will try again this year. My hope is that our adults will step up and commit to helping a patrol be successful in the coming year. UPCOMING EVENTS:

Hatboro Library Bazaar: On Saturday May 5, we will once again assist the Hatboro Library with setting up their semi-annual Library Bazaar. This will consist of setting up tents and tables and then bringing all of the books out of the shed and putting them on tables. Set up begins at 8:00 AM. Take down will begin at 2:30 PM. Troop Re-Organization: As noted above, troop re-organization will take place on Monday May 7, 2018 at our troop meeting. We will elect a new Senior Patrol Leader, form new patrols and then select our new Patrol Leaders. Scouts should plan to be present that night. This is a very important event for everyone.

We will be setting up camp on Friday night, then driving to the put in point on Saturday morning and canoeing back to camp. We will also canoe out on Sunday morning. PAST EVENTS:

Semi Annual Parents Night: We had a great celebration of the troops last six months at our Semi-Annual Parents night on Monday April 9. There were several great recognitions and a fantastic multi-media show at the end. I want to thank Bob John for the countless hours putting that together and to all the scouters that submitted photos. I also want to thank Bruce and Val McCaffrey for the refreshments at the end of the night.

Spruce Run Outpost: We spent what amounted to two weekends at Spruce Run getting this camp ready for College Settlement summer camp. Saturday April 7, 15 scouters traveled to Spruce Run and began working on a number of projects. We re-claimed the star gazing field, cleaned up winter debris and began construction of some long overdue projects. Then on April 20, the entire troop traveled to Spruce Run and completed much of the work that we began two weeks prior. We cleaned up the meeting area, rebuilt the campfire ring, cleaned out the bathrooms and other buildings and lined trails. NEWS AND NOTES:

Summer Camp 2018: As everyone knows, Troop 3 will be going to Camp Buckskin in July of this year. Mr. Dutill has already been doing quite a bit of work behind the scenes. There will be four payments of \$125.00 due for camp fees, the third payment will be due in April. If you have not committed to camp you need to do so now. We estimate the total fee will be \$500.00 for scouts and \$170.00 for scouters. We are trying out an option to pay for camp via our website or you can still pay by the traditional method. New Youth Protection Training: As I mentioned in last month's newsletter, the National Council has changed Youth Protection Training. Not only has the format changed, but the content has changed also. There is no longer a separate YPT for Scouts, Ventures etc. The YPT is now for all disciplines. Every scouter **MUST** complete the new Youth Protection Training prior to October 1 of this year. If you don't complete the training, you will not be rechartered. Please do not wait on this, you can begin the training as early as April 2, 2018.

Camp Cards: Camp Cards are now available. If you are looking for a way for your son to earn his way to summer camp, this is the way.
