Annual Plan: The creation of our 2018-2019 Annual Plan is well underway. We have had two meetings already and will finalize the draft on Tuesday June 5, 2018. Our Senior Patrol Leader, Dan Lee will then present it to the Troop Staff and Committee on Thursday June 14 at Mr. Coopers house at 7:30 PM.

New Youth Protection Training: As I mentioned in last month's newsletter, the National Council has changed Youth Protection Training. Not only has the format changed, but the content has changed also. There is no longer a separate YPT for Scouts, Ventures etc. The YPT is now for all disciplines. Every scouter **MUST** complete the new Youth Protection Training prior to October 1 of this year. If you don't complete the training, you will not be re-chartered. Please do not wait on this, you can begin the training as early as April 2, 2018. Mr. Tellman is now a YPT trainer so we are looking to have him hold a classroom session soon.

National Youth Leadership Training: If you are planning on taking a leadership role in the troop, you must consider attending National Youth Leadership training. If you are the elected SPL or appointed ASPL you must attend, if you are a patrol leader, you should consider attending. Several of our youth leaders have already signed up and several more will sign up. NYLT is an exciting, action packed program designed for councils to provide youth members with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home troops and other situations demanding leadership of self and others. There are five opportunities to attend NYLT this summer. The cost is \$420.00, and Troop 3 will pay ½ the cost upon completion of the week. This will list all the important dates and a packing list. Our final meeting before we leave for camp is Monday July 2. At that time we will finalize all summer camp plans.
