COVID-19 PROCEDURES

As always, the safety of our Scouting family is of utmost importance. We are following State, Local, and Council guidelines when conducting in-person activities. All in-person activities are being held outdoors, masks are required when 6' social distance cannot be maintained, and we are conducting health screening with temperature checks on all participants upon arrival.

If you are having symptoms (fever, shortness of breath, fatigue, diarrhea, etc.) or if you know you have been exposed to Coronavirus in the last 2 weeks, please stay home and take care of yourself.

Outdoor Troop Meeting

We will be having an outdoor troop meeting on **Monday, September 14th at 7:30 PM** in the church parking lot. We will have a visitor to help learn about fire starting and we will be practicing basic knots and lashings. We will also be planning menus for the September Trip to Manassas.

September Trip - Manassas National Battlefield Park

Our September Trip will take us to the Manassas National Battl efield Park, the site of the two Battles of Bull Run. The <u>First Battle of Bull Run</u>, also known as the Battle of First Manassas, was fought on July 21, 1861. It was the first major battle of the American Civil War and was a Confederate victory.

The <u>Second Battle of Bull Run</u> was fought on August 28 to August 30, 1862. General Lee's bold Second Manassas campaign opened the way for the south's first invasion of the north, and a bid for foreign intervention in the war.

We will meet in the HBC parking lot on **Friday, September 18th at 6:00 PM** and return **Sunday, September 20th around 4 PM**. All COVID-19 precautions will be in effect including minimizing people handling food as Patrols do their own cooking and tents will be restricted to one camper per tent.

We'll be camping at the Bull Run Regional Camp. On Saturday, we will be touring the Battlefield on foot, making for a 10-mile hike. On Sunday, we plan to visit the <u>National Museum of the Marine Corps</u>, if it is reopened by then.

Pennsylvania Child Protection Law

If your Pennsylvania State Police Criminal Background check, your Child Abuse Background check or your FBI clearance have expired or will expire, you need to get these items completed as soon as possible. You cannot remain registered by the Cradle of Liberty Council without these items.

Please keep in mind that these documents are good for 5 years. If you filed for a Child Abuse Clearance in 2015 when these requirements came out, you will need to file new ones in 2020. Everyone who is in need should have received an email from Council.
